Teaching and Learning

da Vinci Decathlon

The Decathlon competition places a particular emphasis on higher order thinking skills, problem solving and creativity. 11 teams of students from Years 7 to 10 competed in the decathlon in May. Teams of eight completed timed tasks across 10 disciplines: Engineering, Mathematics, Chess, Code Breaking, Art, Poetry, Science, English, Ideation, Creative producing, Cartography and Legacy.

Write A Book in A Day

Two teams of students from each of Years 8, 9 and 10 participated in the National Writing competition, *Write a Book in a Day*, with the task of composing a book in a day for children with cancer.

Sydney Writers' Festival

114 students attend the Sydney Writers' Festival at the Carriage Works in May for a day full of writing, chatting with their peers, listening to writers evoke passion and emotion through their word. A Year 10 student summarised the day's activities "in a time, when literature is under threat, the importance of creating such a space to have these discussions around the intersection of books and life is vital".

Social Justice

Social Outreach with Centacare

During the school holidays a group of Year 10 and 11 students completed work alongside employees of Centacare at Belmore. Centacare is a Catholic organisation that provides meaningful employment and training for adults living with severe intellectual disabilities. Students worked as part of the Solidarity Program with employees – living a day in the life of someone dealing with an intellectual disability. They were involved in the factory operations, training programs involving cooking and IT skills as well as safety and communication skills. The experience for the boys is very humbling and opens their eyes to a world that they may never have had the opportunity to encounter. The employees also enjoy the time the young men of St Pius X College give to them. During the next holidays the students will provide each employee with a gift for their Christmas party.

Winter Appeal

Driven by Year 9, the College collected goods for St Vincent de Paul, Brookvale and Jesuit Refugee Services, Parramatta during June. As a part of ongoing Social Justice initiatives students are encouraged to consider the plight of those around them, and to act by giving to the poor in handfuls.

BeConnected Program - Willoughby Library

Red Dirt Expedition and Immersion

55 students and staff travelled to outback NSW during the July holidays to engage with rural and remote Aboriginal communities, schools, and visit cultural sites as part of the annual Red Dirt Expedition. The group visited the Warrumbungles Coonabarabran; Sculptures in the Pilliga Scrub, Dandry Gorge, Baradine; Siding Springs Aust Astronomical Telescope, Grand High Tops and Breadknife walk; Baradine NPWS Discovery Centre and Local Area Land Council; Brewarrina Fish Traps and Aboriginal Cultural Centre; Bourke PCYC, Gundabooka NP, Port of Bourke Hotel, Wharf and Fred Hollows Grave Memorial. They visited Schools including St John's Baradine and Baradine Central School; St Lawrence's and Coonabarabran High; St Brigid's and Coonamble High; St Josephs Walgett; St Patrick's Brewarrina and St Ignatius Bourke. This immersion provides students an invaluable first hand insight into Indigenous culture, history and appreciation for rural communities.

Reconciliation Week

The College participated in Indigenous Reconciliation Week (May 27 to June 3) with a powerful Indigenous Reconciliation Ceremony attended by proud Yuin Man Uncle Leslie. Acknowledging he was on Cammeraygal Land Uncle Leslie performed a ritual smoking ceremony and in the process 'smoked' the Indigenous Jerseys worn by the Rugby and Football Teams. The fire used in the ceremony was ignited in the traditional way – by rubbing sticks together in a compelling demonstration of traditional skills, encouraging the flame to come to the group.

The smoking ceremony initiated the student representative teams as Ambassadors for Reconciliation.

The time spent together provided a glimpse into Aboriginal Spirituality for the young men of St Pius X College so that in the coming years they will continue to be true Ambassadors for Reconciliation.

The College also hosted proud Cammeraygal elder Professor Dennis Foley PhD, MBA, to a School Assembly in May. As a survivor of the stolen generation, and veteran of Vietnam, Dennis, through sharing his stories, helped students understand their roles as contemporary custodians of the land, and inheritors of the story of the country on which they learn, play and live. Dennis' teaching will inform the College's Reconciliation Action Plan and initiatives such as the Red Dirt Expedition, Immersions and Aboriginal teaching and learning throughout the year.

Playground upgrade

John Couani succeeded Brother Michael Hoffman in 2011, thereby becoming the first Lay Principal of the College since it was founded in 1937. John fostered a vibrant and varied life at the College, marked by his energetic personal commitment to all forms of education, underpinned by an unwavering belief in the Catholic Faith. John embraced the four EREA Touchstones of Gospel Values, Justice and Solidarity, Liberation Spirituality and Inclusive community, to offer a wholistic educational experience for students that had its practical manifestation in the great variety of educational activities, rituals and ceremonies in the daily life of the College.

John made a point of engaging with all people both within

and associated with the College community: whether it be delivering speeches on formal occasions, meeting local dignitaries, taking an interest in the work and wellbeing of all students and teachers, attending a myriad number of school related functions and activities or simply making a point of greeting and farewelling as many people as possible as they arrived or left the College grounds. He was compassionate in his dealing with others, wise in his management of school processes and genuinely happy to be involved in festive celebrations.

John led St Pius X College as it moved from the foundations of the Christian Brothers into one that is an authentic school in the Edmund Rice tradition as presented by EREA.
