OFFICIAL OPENING AND BLESSING BY MOST REV. ARCHBISHOP KELLY.

THE establishment of a new school in the name of the Holy Spirit has been the outcome of a long and arduous task. On Tuesday afternoon, January 19th, 1937, the Most Rev. Archbishop of Sydney, His Grace, the Archbishop of Sydney, Most Rev. Dr. Kelly, D.D., officially opened and blessed the new High School and Residence for the Christian Brothers in the progressive parish of Chatswood, a suburb of Sydney.

The site of the erection of these two edifices is unique with its location of well-ventilated light and convenience on the part of the Christian Brothers, who have demonstrated a ready and unflinching spirit in their work. The school and residence were the work of the Christian Brothers, who have shown a keen interest in the education of the youth of the parish. There was a large and representative gathering at the school's opening. The feast of the Holy Spirit was celebrated by the Rev. Fr. James.

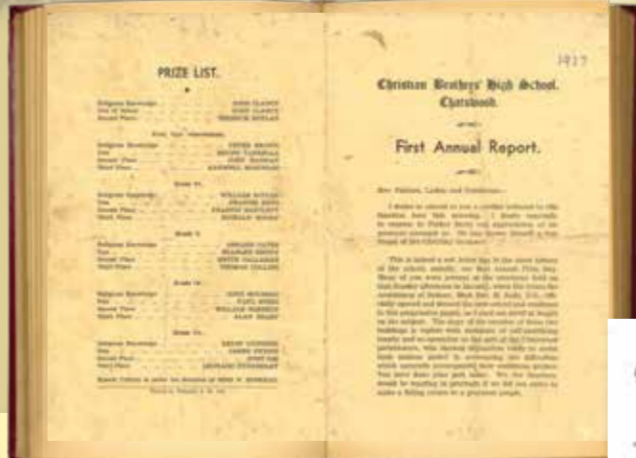
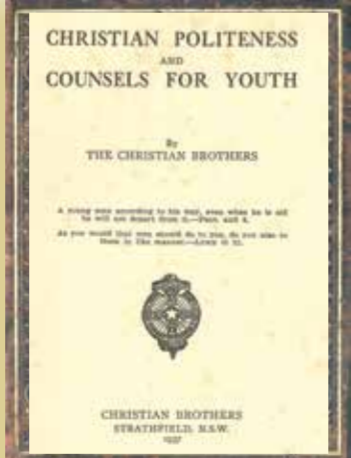
