


THIE establishment of a *co-education boys'* school in certain portions of the North Shore line has been



latter portion of the North Moreton Bay has been

The entire sum of £10,000 of these two schools is replace-

of the Catholic parishioners, who showed themselves ever ready to assist
their native Pastor, Very Rev. Father T. Murphy, P.P., who was
a old pupil of our School in Mafeking. Mons. Hussey
Hannan were the architects, and Mr. H. A. Taylor was the builder.
