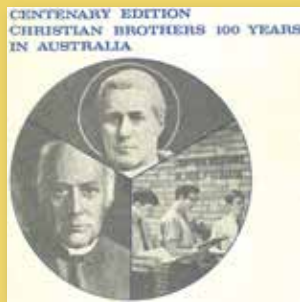

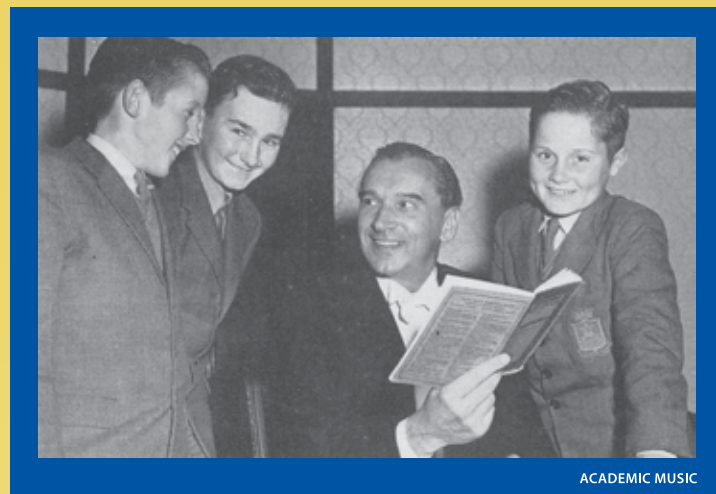

With lessons learnt 'neath the blue and gold!

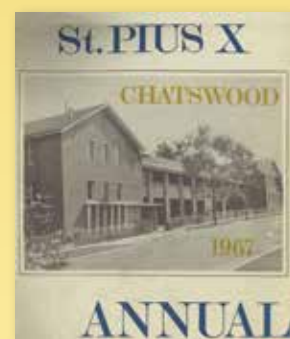
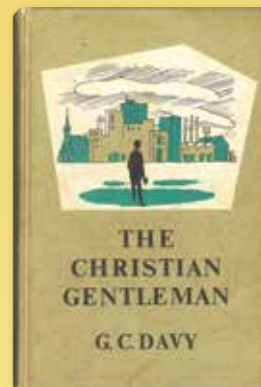

Although the first book was only accessioned in December, 1965, the College Library is by no means in its infancy. It has grown a great deal this year and is still growing. All boys, I am

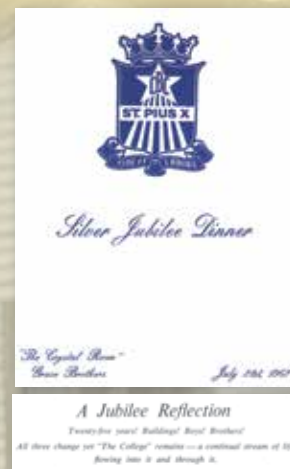


Y.C.S. NEW GUINEA PROJECT
